VERY IMPORTANT ! Read and understand all directions and check the following parts list before starting installation.

Note: No frame cutting or drilling needed.

Roll Pan cutting is required.

License plate must be repositioned when ball mount is being used (use SSE part # 61100 Flip License Kit or equivalent.

1/2" Drive ratchet, 3/4" Socket, Torque Wrench, 3" Extension, 3/4" Combo Wrench, Safety Glasses.							

1. Before beginning installation be sure to wear proper eye protection.

- Cut roll pan in license plate area to provide ball mount installation and pin clip access. Check location before cutting. Note: License plate <u>Must</u> be repositioned or a Flip License Kit (SSE # 950-61100) Installed while ball mount is in use.
- 3. Remove all fasteners from plastic bag and identify.
- 4. Position rear most slots in receiver over fore/aft slots near end of frame. Install the 1/2" X 2 1/4" by 1/4" heavy duty washers on the 1/2" X 3/4" bolts and set inside frame rail into receiver. Install flat washer and nut. Finger tighten only at this time.
- 5. Install all other fasteners in same matter in punched holes in frame into receiver.
- 6. Tighten all 1/2" GR5 fasteners installed to 75 ft. lbs. with torque wrench.
- 7. Affix load rating label in license plate area of roll pan.

Note: Check hitch frequently, making sure all fasteners and ball are properly tightened. If hitch is removed, replace all Ny-Lock nuts when re-installing. A hitch or ball which has been damaged should be removed and replaced. Observe safety precautions when working beneath a vehicle and wear eye protection. Follow vehicle manufacturer's specifications for maximum trailer weight and tongue weight.
